Courses choice

Exchange students can follow both undergraduate and postgraduate course. Please note: courses from the Department of Korean Studies are closed to exchange students for the 2022/2023 academic year.

French as a Foreign Language (FLE) courses

Language prerequisites

All proficiency levels are available from A1 (full beginner) to C1 (advanced).

Please note that a French language test will be sent to incoming students before their arrival at Inalco. Its results will determine the group level to which the student will be registered at Inalco, regardless of other results from DELF/DALF exams.

Students enrolled for the academic year will be expected to remain within the same group throughout the year. For example, it will not be possible to take B1 level courses in the first semester and B2 level courses in the second semester.

Professional Track courses (undergraduate-level courses only)

Students wishing to enrol on a Professional Track course have to submit additional documents during their online application. Admission results to said courses will be sent separately from the admission to the International Student Exchange Programme.

Admitted students will be able to enrol on the selected Professional Track courses.

Professional Track courses are not open to students who did not specifically apply for them.

Only the Professional Track courses mentioned in this document are open to exchange students.

Professional Track courses: International Relations

Admission requirements

- ✓ Provide certification of the following level of French: C1 minimum acquired
- ✓ Provide certification of the following level of English: B2 minimum acquired for courses taught in English
- ✓ Include the following documents with the Application Form:
 - Certificate of French level C1 (DALF Certificate from the home university)
 - Certificate of English level B2 (TOEFL IELTS TOEIC)
 - A CV in French or English
 - A cover letter in French, mentioning the exact chosen courses

Courses choice

Admitted student will be allowed to enrol on the courses taught in French. Admitted students providing a B2 level in English will be allowed to enrol on the courses taught in English.
