Conference presentation:

Satire, as a literary device combining realism and social criticism, has been an essential mode of expression for vernacular Jewish languages (in prose, in poetry, or on stage) to confront the radical transformations both Ashkenazi and Sephardi populations have gone through since the 19th century.

This one-day conference aims at creating new bonds between researchers studying Judeo-Spanish and Yiddish languages in order to analyze both the similarities and differences in the satirical use of vernacular tongues traditionally considered as minor and associated with the private sphere. The development of periodicals and the opening of these popular languages to new fields (science, politics, belles-lettres) favored the appearance of a critical and comical literature which played on the discrepancy between the traditional world, reflected in the very fabric of the language, and the new social realities brought by modernity: industrialization, new ideologies (Socialism, Zionism, etc.), evolutions in religiosity (secularism, assimilation, etc.).
